

Dear Twin Creeks Neighbors,

While we've made meaningful progress in several areas, there is still much to be done to improve our processes and responsiveness to the community. Here are some key updates:

◆ Updated Modification Guidelines

As shared in last month's communication and reviewed during the recent Open Board Meeting, the updated Modification Guidelines have now been published. This comprehensive revision enhances the document's structure, formatting, and usability—including direct links to specific guideline sections. Our goal was to reflect evolving architectural trends, landscaping options, and frequently requested modifications within the community. We believe the result is a more accessible and helpful resource for all residents.

◆ HOA Office Update

During the Open Meeting, we discussed potential options regarding the future of the on-site HOA office. These options will soon be posted on our website, along with a voting link to decide whether or not to sell the property. We will notify residents via email once the materials and voting information are available.

◆ Working Capital Contribution Amendment

We also reviewed a proposed amendment introducing a Working Capital Contribution. This one-time fee—equal to the current annual assessment—would be paid by new homebuyers at closing. The intent is to strengthen our reserve funds and reduce the likelihood of future assessment increases. The proposal and voting link will be shared on the website shortly.

◆ Reserve Study and Vendor Selection

We have received multiple competitive proposals for a new Reserve Study and completed a thorough comparative analysis. These proposals vary significantly in scope and cost, and we aim to finalize our selection by mid-May. We are committed to choosing a qualified, cost-effective, and comprehensive provider. Once finalized, full details will be shared with the community.

◆ From the Communications Committee

Communications initiatives such as the website update, text, zoom for meetings, request handling process improvement, an official TCCA Facebook page, and others are on pause. These initiatives require partnership with our management company, CMA, for action beyond the committee's access and purview. The required resources are not currently being made available to complete that portion of implementation. We'll resume these important topics when support becomes available.

Note from Robert Merlo:

"I'm concerned about the lack of support hindering progress on these high-priority projects. To address this, I will begin holding bi-weekly one-hour meetings with CMA to identify constraints and determine how we can move these initiatives forward effectively."

◆ Commitment to Our Six Pillars

We remain committed to the six pillars that guide Twin Creeks' success. These principles inform every decision we make and reflect our shared vision to keep Twin Creeks "The Place to Live!"

Stay Involved

As highlighted throughout this update, many important discussions take place at our Open Board Meetings. We strongly encourage all residents to attend—it's the best way to stay informed, ask questions, and actively contribute to our community's success.

COMPLIANCE CORNER

Modification Applications

With pleasant weather upon us, you may be considering exterior modifications or landscaping enhancements. Before you begin your spring projects, please ensure a seamless and hassle-free process by submitting a Modification Application (MA) request form to your Modification Committee for approval. All MA requests should be submitted through the homeowner portal at twincreekshoa.net.

Fence Staining

If you're planning to replace or re-stain your fence, begin your project by reading pp. 21-25 in the new Modifications document. Don't forget to submit an MA request and select a stain color that is approved within the Twin Creeks community. Be sure to review the community's acceptable "Medium Brown" stain options.

Dark brown may be considered. Alternate stains or paint colors are NOT allowed. Although we cannot make specific brand recommendations, the Association has used OLYMPIC Dark Mahogany Semi-Transparent Stain Color and OLYMPIC Mahogany Solid Stain Color. See color spectrum: Picture below is Typical Medium Brown.

LANDSCAPE AND GARDENING

April and May are seeing a lot of Twin Creeks residents replacing sod, particularly in front yards. Some for beauty enhancement of year-round thickness and color, many for health as original plantings were normally Bermuda, and as shade trees matured with thick canopies, sunlight was severely compromised. For some, St. Augustine has been the replacement selection, as it does well in the shade. Others do not care for the broad blade appearance. For them, Zoysia has become very popular in the last few years. The two most popular varieties are Zeon, and Palisades. A comparison:

Zoysia Zeon

- **Texture:** Very fine-bladed and soft (almost like Bermuda or hybrid grasses).
- **Color:** Deep green and very lush.
- **Shade tolerance:** Excellent (one of the best among Zoysias).
- **Drought tolerance:** Good, but not as high as Palisades.
- **Growth habit:** Dense and slow-growing, which means less mowing but also slower recovery if damaged.
- **Maintenance:** Low; doesn't require frequent mowing or fertilizing.
- **Foot traffic:** Moderate tolerance.
- **Use case:** Ideal for high-end residential lawns, golf courses (fairways/tees), and areas where aesthetics are key.

Zoysia Palisades

- **Texture:** Coarser than Zeon but still relatively soft.
- **Color:** Medium to dark green.
- **Shade tolerance:** Good, but not quite as good as Zeon.
- **Drought tolerance:** Excellent—one of the best among Zoysias.
- **Growth habit:** Upright and faster-growing than Zeon, making it better for recovery.
- **Maintenance:** Slightly more mowing needed than Zeon, but still low overall.
- **Foot traffic:** High tolerance—good for active families or pets.
- **Use case:** Great for residential and commercial properties needing durability and visual appeal.



After installation, be sure to adequately water to encourage root health and development. Unless nature has provided heavy rainfall, 10-15 minutes daily for the first two weeks is recommended. If temperatures are continuously in the 90s, twice daily may be required.

SPRING INTO ACTION! PICKLEBALL LADDER - 3 WEEKS TO GO!





Check Out the Updated Modification Guidelines

After a lengthy process that included numerous meetings with the Modification Committee, CMA staff and the Board, the Twin Creeks Modification Guidelines have been updated.

The rigorous review and resulting updates were made with considerations around current architecture and design standards and trends and technology considerations (e.g., permanent outdoor lighting). We also sought guidance from the Twin Creeks' landscape and arbor experts as well as the Texas A&M Forest Service to review and update the recommended trees and shrubbery for landscaping options.


As many homeowners have likely never reviewed the document, we encourage you to take a look as it not only offers information about the modification request and approval process but also offers insight to ensure homes meet the clearly defined standards for property maintenance.

The updated reference was designed to be much more user friendly with hyperlinks from the table of contents, easier to read formatting, and more pictures as to acceptable (and sometimes unacceptable) solutions.

Ever wonder if an update or modification to your home requires approval in advance? A good rule of thumb is to assume that any updates or changes made to the exterior of your home may require a review and approval so we encourage you to consult this resource. And if ever in doubt, reach out to CMA to check as it could save you a lot of frustration, time and money by getting proper approvals in advance.

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RECIPE OF THE MONTH



OLD FASHIONED COCONUT CREAM PIE

As summer approaches, some of our palates shift, so our menu preferences follow. From hot chocolate to margaritas (OK, some of you drink margaritas all year long!), and with desserts, from apple and pumpkin pies to key lime and coconut cream to remind us of warm sandy beaches and palm trees. So here, from Ashwood baking legend Lori Bajema, a 5-star favorite of all her family, friends, and neighbors.

Prep time: 20 minutes

Cook Time: 30 minutes

Ready In: 4hrs. 50 min.

INGREDIENTS

2 cups sweetened flaked coconut	¼ teaspoon salt
1 can Coco Lopez crème coconut + enough half-and-half to measure 3 cups	1 teaspoon vanilla extract
2 eggs, beaten	1 (9 inch) pie shell, baked
¾ cup white sugar	1 cup frozen whipped topping, thawed (add a little coconut extract)
½ cup all-purpose flour	

DIRECTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C)
2. Spread the coconut on a baking sheet and bake it, stirring occasionally, until golden brown, about 5 minutes.
3. In a medium saucepan, combine the half-and-half, eggs, sugar, flour, and salt, and mix well.
4. Bring to a boil over low heat, stirring constantly, for 2 minutes more. Remove the pan from the heat and stir in ¾ cup of the toasted coconut and the vanilla extract. Reserve the remaining coconut to top the pie.
5. Pour the filling into the pie shell and chill until firm, about 4 hours.
6. Remove from refrigerator. Spread frozen whipped topping. Top with remaining flaked coconut.




